Thinking back too those days --- now almost fifty years ago, I am of the opinion that all of Joe's mags were well laid out, AFTER Bart and I starte to work for him. He had two very good lay out men in Waldrop and Itra in a they kew type faces very well and used them to great effect. One anly has to grance through the old copies to see this.

I particularlyenjoyed working on BOXING AND WRESTLING. It was MY BABY. I had urgen Joe, cajolled him might be the better word to use, intobranching out from muscle mags. The xid, This wwas hisfirst inde; endsnt venture. In fact I liked to work on all his mags and I was THE ONLY ONE WHO WAS AND WRITING FOR SLALL HIS MAGS, apart from the fag mags, with which I would have nothing to do, and the Baseball mag, about which I knew nothin and was content to have it that way. Some of the historical content of Joess mags, particularly in the days before art and I were workingfor him, were not to accurate. But all in all and, again in my opinion, may were the best boody mags of their type ever put out—— PERIOD. They had a certain down to earth quality, a forthrightness that his mags so sadly lack today. I wrote for every bloody one of his mags—— again excepting his fag mags and his baseball mag, and I was THE ONLY ONE WHO COLLED NO THAT. NO ONE ELSE ON HIS STAFF CLULD. PERIOD.

Wes the mags were fun to work on, Joe spoiled it all with the way he went on and his obviousdetermination to screw every ounce he culd dut of those working for him. He treated his employees not like trusted men but as BUSINESS RIVALS. I think he was just unable to help himself ming this.

Yes, bodybuilders DID bork as shipping clerks. When I want to wank for Joz on January 1st, 1950, we had but one shipping man, Abe Goldberg this time when it came to shipping and unliading weights, we ALL took a hand, Joe, me, Bart and Abe. But as he gradually grew bigger, he got more people involved in the shipping. At this time, 1950, we occupied ONLY the ground floor. The two upper floors were occupied by a dress making shop But they moved out and Joe took over the entirs bulding. He then hired Cobert and, when Abe opened his own gym then took on Lengeters. When Colbert was hurt in a motor cycle acciden, Joe took on a speculaid little bloke name Jukio Acosta. What appened when I told him to stuff it—— Joe I mean— I dont know.
